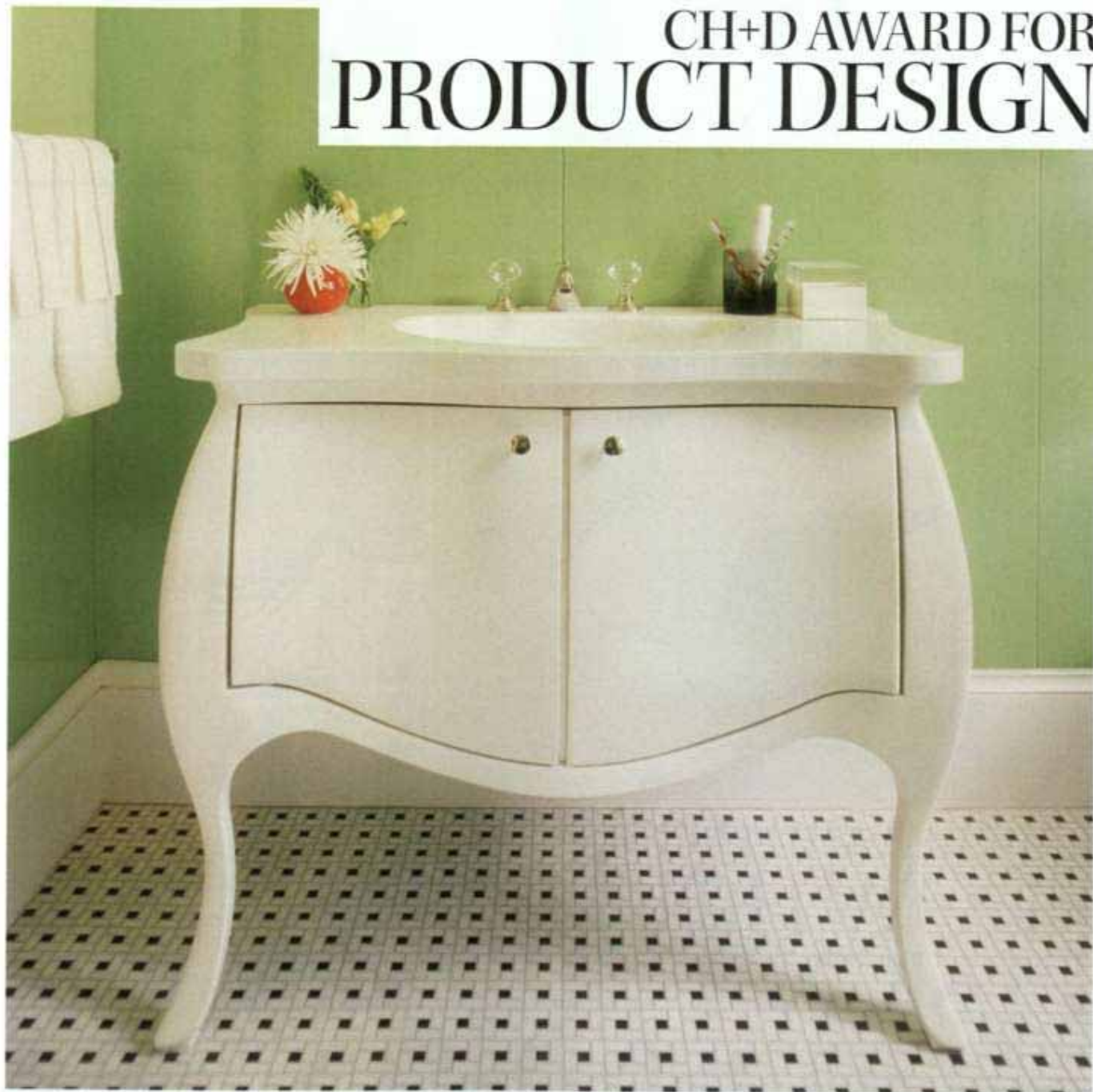

## STEVEN MILLER STEVEN MILLER DESIGN STUDIO

**I**n the 2005 San Francisco Decorator Showcase's upstairs bathroom, designer Steven Miller debuted his modern take on the classic Louis XVI bombé vanity: a curvy 34-by-42-by-22-inch cabinet that he created using DuPont Corian.

"I initially thought about using an antique, but the room took on a more referential attitude. And because it's a wet place, I needed to use a material like Corian,"

says Miller. Constructed of 12 pieces of Corian bonded together, and with cast legs and slumped cabinet doors, the vanity looks like one solid piece. "That's the beauty of this material: It's seamless, which makes it really maintainable," says Miller. "And I love the tactile, almost chalklike feel of it." —*Jennie Nunn*

Miller's Corian vanity resembles an elegant bombé chest, with a matte finish and polished-nickel hardware by Waterworks.
